self-checkout and check -in kiosks, embedded hearing aid assists in meeting rooms, 3-D printers in the Learning Studio and more.

There are 43 publicly accessible computers, tablets and printers in Learning Studio.

The library also includes a new Learning Garden adjacent to the entrance!

The Learning Garden will offer opportunities for gardening classes and outdoor story-time space.

The grand opening last Saturday attracted over 2500 people!!!
